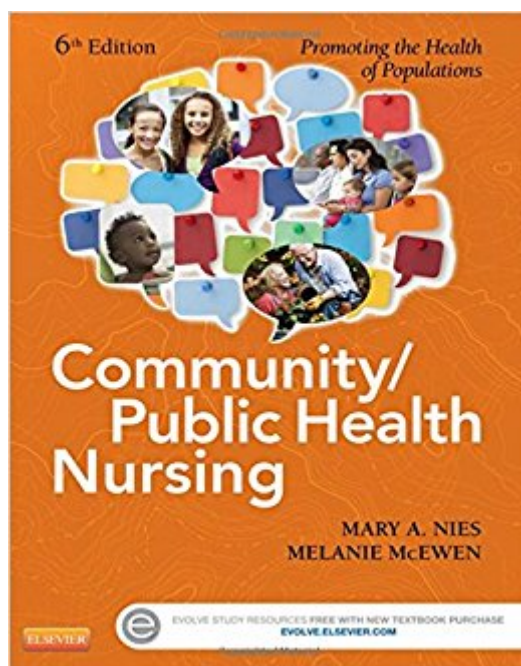


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Community/Public Health Nursing: Promoting The Health Of Populations, 6e

Very poorly written textbook. It reads like a 650 page APA-formatted paper. It's repetitive, not just from chapter to chapter, but from paragraph to paragraph. I literally have had the feeling of deja vu several times while reading different chapters. It cites authors with no explanation for them as in who they are or what they do or why we care about what they have to say . There is very little emphasis on important theories or applications. Mentions of what "this author" has done shouldn't even be included. The fact that you used a theory in your work means nothing to me. Very poorly formatted e-book. The tables and charts are quite distorted and difficult to interpret. The content of the book is easily read and understood, and as far as a nursing textbook goes this is a leisurely read. I would recommend renting a paperback copy because the e-book is difficult to navigate, and so many of the figures are poorly formatted. Not worth the convenience of an e-book.
