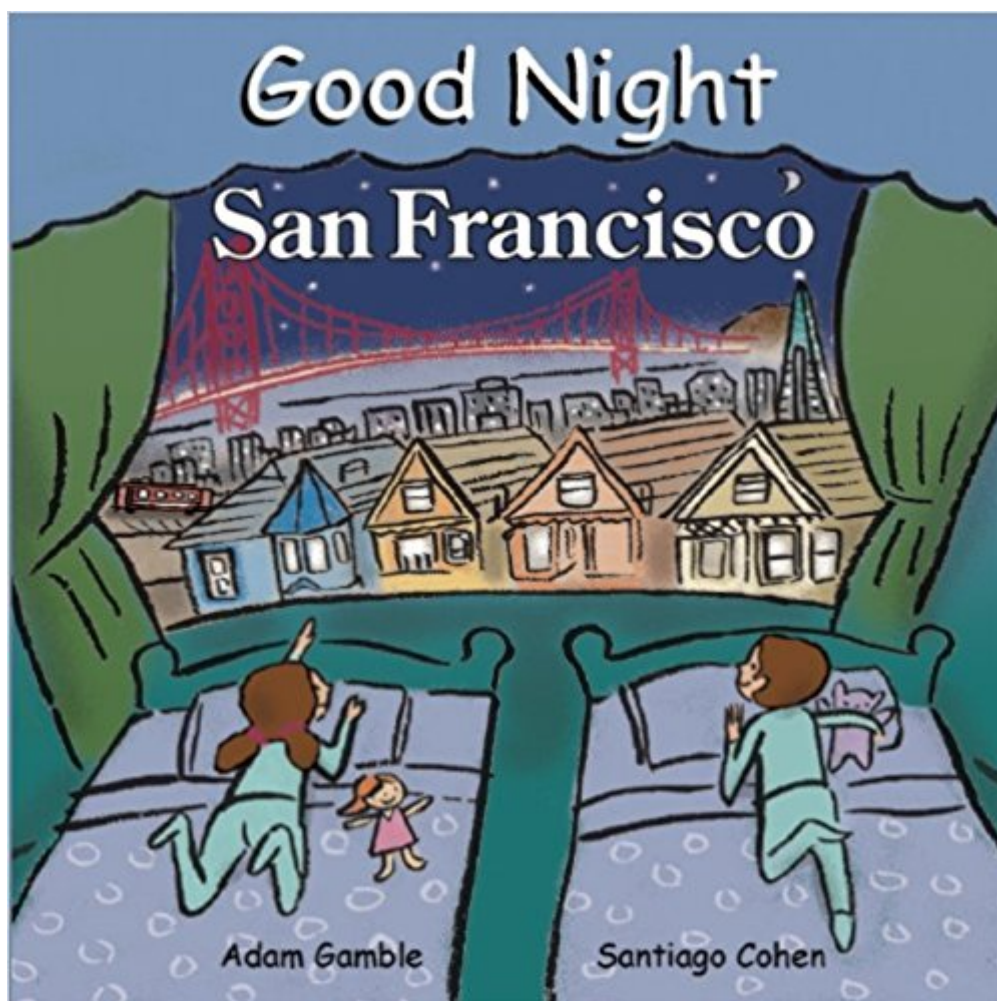

It's great because when the kids visit SF, they immediately recognize landmarks from the book such as the Golden Gate Bridge, Coit Tower, the cable cars, and even Muir Woods in nearby.

Adorable, sweet story, nicely illustrated. I had seen this book when I was in San Francisco and couldn't fit one more thing in my carry on I was glad to be able to order it from . The only issue is that the pages were stuck together. They hadn't been separated. I had to use a knife to unstick them. I was surprised at this lack of quality/inspection. The rating I give is not 5 stars due to this issue.

I wish the drawings were a bit more colorful and had crisper lines. I have the Good Night Boston book and she loves the pictures because they are sharper and more colorful. She's only 3 months but I can tell she's excited because her arms and legs move about quickly when I read this to her. However, when I read the Good Night San Francisco book to her, she doesn't move as much because of the pictures. I want her to know where I grew up and the book captures the highlights of SF.

Our son was so happy when he got this book for Christmas. It turned out that they had it at his preschool. Living in the Bay Area our four year old son has made day trips into the city. He was excited to see all the places he had been. It also prompted us to plan day trips to a few of the places we have not visited yet.

I bought this for my 2 year old son before our trip to San Francisco. It really enhanced our trip! Anytime we saw something from this book, he would pull the book out to tell us about it. It helped him to remember the places and their names.
