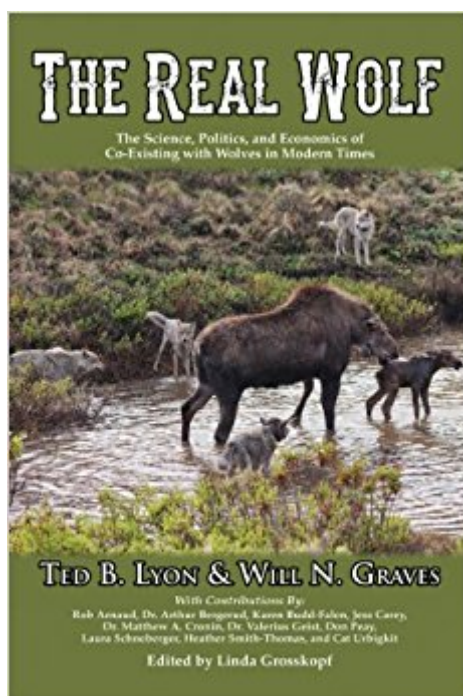

Lyon and Will N. Graves, deserves widespread readership for methodically and scientifically setting to rest the sentimental modern mythology about the wolf so prevalent here in the East, where the lack of accurate information has allowed radical environmentalists to recruit well-meaning people to their pro-wolf movement. This book is an excellent effort to put the wolf reintroduction into real world perspective. While the essay format makes it seem a little jumbled, the content is to the point. I found the observations regarding cattle stress very interesting as they mirror content from historical reports of buffalo herd stress when they were still present. The book also captures common anecdotal remarks I heard from locals in Montana and Wyoming. Anyone interested in wildlife management, the environmental "movement", either pro or con, should have this book on their shelf. The authors definitely make the case that the reintroduction was over sold, under managed, and certainly not benign.
