

I'm a recruiter and career advisor, and I try to read as many career/job books as I can. This is a good one. In the course of my job, I speak individually to more than 1,000 people every year about their jobs and careers. The common theme is that they want something "more", but they don't know what "more" means. They cling to outdated notions of success that have little relationship to career satisfaction. Marc does a great job of explaining how and why this happens, and how to change it. His insights are based on his own personal experience as well as his experience as a career advisor. From my vantage point, when people fail to navigate a career change, it's because they don't know what they're trying to change and what they're looking for. They don't know what "more" means. This book will help you better understand what "more" means to you. One note - if you're looking for a book on how to polish your resume or how to troll the online jobs sites or how to use Twitter to find a job, this book is NOT for you. Buy this book first to figure out the what and the why of career change, then go buy the polish-your-resume book later when you know what you're

looking for.

"Disclaimer: I know Mr. Marc Miller through a few 'circles' here in our awesome tech/social media/awesome community of Austin, TX. This book is subtitled 'A Practical Guide for Baby Boomers,' however I feel that it very easily applies to anyone that is switching careers, jobs, or in any type of professional job transition. From here on out we will refer to a transition as a 'pivot'. Marc writes in such a way as to give us the juice without us having to squeeze a lot of pulp to get it. By this I mean that he writes to those of us with short attention spans (isn't that all of us these days) without giving you the fat that comes with most career advice. He speaks from very worldly experience. The book is divided up into 14-15 quick reading chapters that never lose your eyes through a set of personal stories (like), questions designed to provoke thought (wish authors did this more), advice (tested and tried), and action items (without action there can be no real change and/or benefit, yes?) at the end of each chapter. (Note - on the kindle version Marc has links which can be clicked on so that you can download these 'action items)'. Spoiler: (this is the part I enjoyed most)!! Marc encourages you to go back and 'inventory' your past jobs/careers, and includes a system of questions that are designed to benefit you by finding patterns. These patterns were there all along, it's just that most of us have never gone back and looked for them. Just like a good shopkeeper would inventory his store to find out about the bad items and those which don't sell (and the ones that do) this process can only help you. I have started to inventory the many jobs I have had since I was 12, asking myself the questions that Marc poses. It is a lot of work for someone with such a varied background, but the results really surprised me! One of the things I appreciate most about Marc's book is the emphasis he places on being able to articulate what you are doing with your career, why you are "repurposing" it and what that will look like. So many people are foundering in the water because they can't even put into words what it is that they are doing. A close number two, is his pointer that you ask for A.I.R. This means asking for Advice from people in the field, Insights and Recommendations for this transition. You can't and shouldn't do this kind of thing on your own. Marc is practical, down-to-earth and unassuming. You can seriously read this book in under an hour, but you will keep it with you as your personal handbook to transitioning your life.
