I am a former missionary. I found the idea that the heroine of this story wanting to be a missionary, but not doing any preparation for this to be rather strange. If you are called by God to be a missionary, you don't wait to meet a man who also wants to be a missionary-- you do some preparation work for this. You don't put conditions on God that you will go only if you find a husband who also wants to be a missionary. I did enjoy the book. Cultural adaptation takes time. Most missionaries are not required to eat monkeys and jungle creatures as are those in this book, and I also find it difficult to believe that they would stay in one small village for such a long time. Missionaries who do Bible translation are usually from Wycliffe and they do get training in translation, jungle living, survival skills and such. I find it hard to believe that she would not have had this training. But the story was interesting, despite the difficulties that I had with the premise.
