

In Germany after the outbreak of World War I, he claimed Ireland's right to independent nationhood; he returned to Ireland in 1916, was captured, taken to London, tried, and hanged as a traitor. To further discredit him, the British government released what purported to be his diaries, which contained details of promiscuous homosexual activities. This is an excellent biography of Roger Casement, an invariably decent man. He was an Irish patriot although he served England for most of his life.Only in his last years did he turn his back on England and take up the struggle for Irish independence. But his grueling service in Africa had weakened his constitution and he was no longer entirely responsible for his decisions and actions. He was betrayed by someone he trusted and was captured during an ill-fated attempt to run guns from war-time Germany for Irish resisters of British rule.At trial, the Prosecution persuaded the jury to condemn him to death by revealing the libidinous details of his diary. It was his homosexual obsession with teenagers that placed the noose about his neck.Here Casement's terrible fate is related in all its pathos. This is a truly commendable biography, both in substance and style and I recommend it highly.
