

Living and fighting among the Indian tribes, Jubal Sackett forged a legend as powerful medicine man they called "Ni'kwana, master of mysteries." And with Itchakomi, the proud Natchez princess, he walked the path of courage that future Sacketts would follow. --This

What can one say regarding the works of Louis L'Amoure that his fans do not realize? Jubal is a continuation of the trials and tribulations experienced by the Sackett family in their quest to establish themselves in a beautiful if dangerous new land where tonly the laws of survival allow those who have the courage to venture forth into the unknown. Louis's ability to invent a family in the "Old Country" and follow it through generations, to establish a new and improved one, bringing along their faith and traditions, kept in tact through out, is almost beyond comprehension. All of his books are excellent, but those regarding the Sacketts are exceptional.

if you are following the life-stories of the various members of the Sackett family in pioneering and settling the new land of America in the 17th century this is number 4 and relates the personal quest of Jubal Sackett as he explores where no white man has been before. His story becomes bound up with that of a beautiful Indian princess so that together they face an unknown but beckoning future into the high mountains and beyond. Jubal finds inspiration and courage from remembering Barnabas Sackett the founding father of the family line. This is another well-crafted tale from Louis L'Amour with its usual supply of unexpected twists and tense moments.

I love the Sackett stories. The woodcraft and work ethic of the pioneers has been under-reported by other authors, but L'Amour always gets the details of staying unseen while hunting, tracking and wilderness survival precisely right.

The year is 1630. It's the story of one of the first white men to travel beyond the Mississippi River to the Colorado region. There are few indians, since horses were not readily available yet. The sights, the scenery, what Jubal had to endure! It's a book to reread; it's that good.

Louis Lamour is the best. This book I have read 3 times and always enjoy the adventure. The picture that Louis Lamour paints with his words is so clear, I feel like I'm right there with Jubal. A fun and enjoyable read, that ends too soon.
