This series as a whole is fantastic. Carlie N Holmberg has set herself up to develop this series if she

chooses to...You'll see what I mean. These books are really an enjoyable read! I think what I enjoyed most about these books (with out giving too much away) is the simplicity of the love story. The story is really about the journey and obstacles that Ceony has to overcome, her love story compliments the journey, and doesn't over power the books (aside from the first book, but I still think the comment rings true.) There is no *major drama between the two and it is quite refreshing for two characters to just accept and adapt to the humanity and flaws of each other so easily. I will say that there were a couple instances where I thought the book should have gone in a different direction, some things are left unexplained or undeveloped...but continuing the series would solve that.

Disappointing end to a series that started strongly. I like the concept for the world, and some of the characters, but the protagonist got more annoying as time went on with her reckless and frequently stupid behavior. Or the story wasted time walking through every step of an ordinary day. The new characters in the third book were cardboard cutouts for the most part (no paper puns intended), the spells increasingly improbably and superpowered even for a lady with such perfect recall. I could go on but it'd get into real spoilers and the upshot of it all is I stopped caring about the characters for all the annoyances that tossed me out of the story.

Disappointing end to the series. Ceony was so self absorbed, self righteous, and annoying in this book! I totally understand her hurt and shock over what happened in the last book, but she spends most of this one lying to everyone and being totally reckless. And there are basically no consequences. I'm all for happy endings, but I don't feel like she learned anything after all that drama. And I really, really disliked how Prit was treated. He wasn't exactly likeable, but she was a spoiled brat with him... you'd have thought she was 16 in this book instead of 21.

This was such a great conclusion to this fun series. The only reason I gave it 4 stars instead of the 5 I gave to the other books is because the ending seemed a bit abrupt to me. I felt like an epilogue was needed so we could really feel the closure of knowing that everyone lived happily ever after instead of that just being implied. Maybe some readers prefer to use their imagination as to where the characters go when we leave their stories, but I like to have it spelled out for me. I wanted to know what the decision would be about how to handle Ceony's knowledge of bond-breaking. I wanted to see the scene that Ceony saw in the fortuity box actually play out. I understand why the author chose to end the story where she did, but just my own personal preference would have preferred a nice shiny bow on top of the gift that the ending was. Hope that makes sense. :) I liked

where all of the characters ended up, I guess I just wanted more, which speaks to how great the series really was- it was the kind you're sad to see end! Anyway, I really enjoyed this series and would highly recommend it to anyone who needs a little taste of magic in their life. And it made me want to take up origami, so there's also that. :)

This was a great deal of fun and I am a bit sad that it is over. I really enjoyed the idea of the magic system and the interaction of the magic in the world. And it was fun to see the evolution of the main character through this trilogy. I would recommend these books for anyone looking for a bit of fun reading. I would have liked to have all of the books a bit longer, but the size makes for quick reads.

There were some perfect moments that encompassed the entire series in a moment, but I kind of wish Ceony had resolved the major, antagonistic conflict, just like I felt after The Glass Magician. Still, this was a great conclusion.

I am a lover of books that involve magic (HP forever) and I almost didn't read this trilogy for some of the reviews, although it has a great rating. But I am so glad I went with my gut. It was a great story, full of suspense and a different usage/perspective of magic. The first book (The Paper Magician) is developed in it's majority in a place you wouldn't have thought. Quite exciting, I most say that I read it almost too fast thanks to the anxiety it made me feel. The characters got to know each other and bond in an unexpected way. The second book (The Glass Magician) was even better. Sometimes the main character is quite stubborn, but well, all good adventurous characters are (ehem, Harry Potter). This last one maintained the dynamics of the first too and you could see the progress of the main character in her expertise and handling of magic. She knows and uses a secret nobody else does. It is also the most romantic of the trilogy in a subtle way, which is great since this a romantic novel. I would have loved to read more about the outcome of the relationship at the end but understood and loved that it was left to my imagination. Great trilogy, you will read them in a heartbeat.
