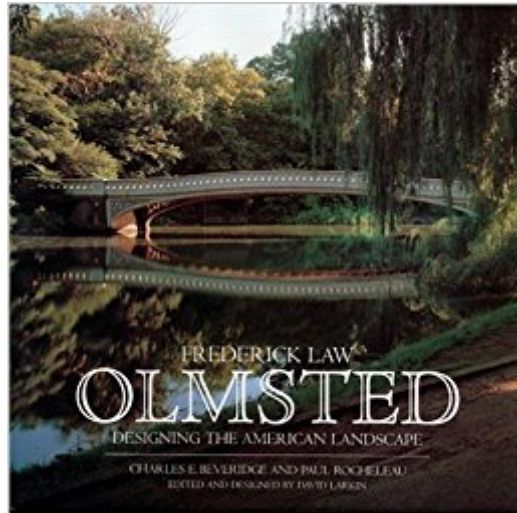

He is the author of many bestselling books including Universe's Frank Lloyd Wright: Master Builder.
