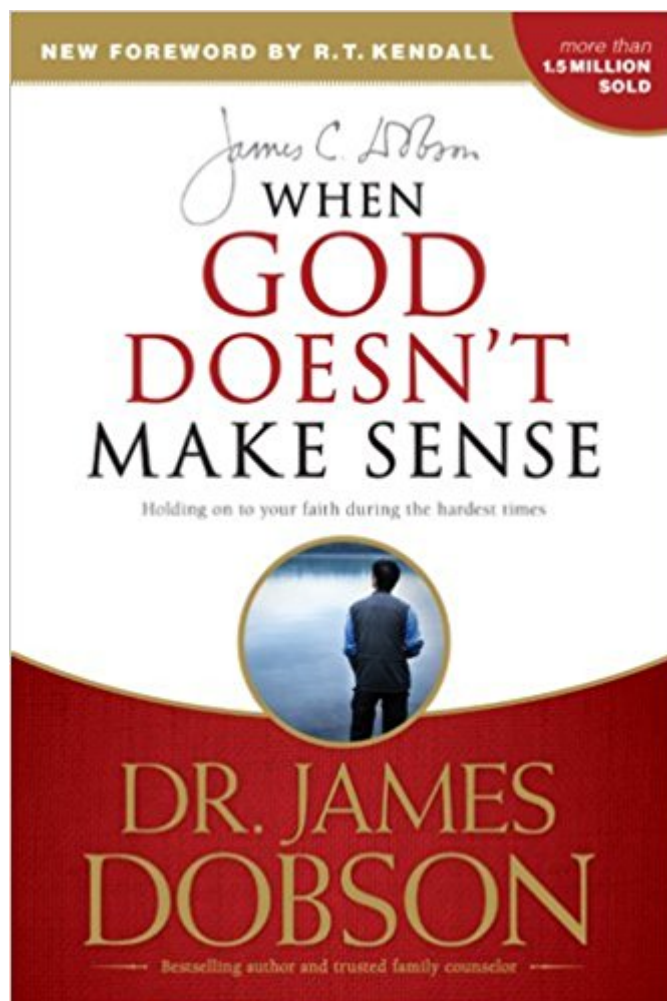

If you have had a tragedy in your life you will never be the same...you will either be worse off than before (angry, bitter, resentful, and feeling like you have been betrayed), or you can be stronger than before (growing from the lessons learned, learning how to help others avoid your tragedy (or recover from a similar tragedy, etc). When I suddenly lost my son I can look back at that time & confidently say that this book was one of the biggest things that helped me get through that tragedy. It's important that we try our best to understand the nature of God, from the truth of his word, rather than to be fooled by misinformation & misunderstanding.

The problem of evil and pain in light of a sovereign and loving God is one of the hardest topics to address in Christianity, and so many, even strong Christians, come up against painful circumstances in their lives and have their faith greatly shaken, if not lost altogether. James Dobson takes the difficulties head on and answers them with great compassion, a wealth of biblical knowledge, and an abundance of personal experience, as he has been counseling for many years. I appreciated the answers he gives on this subject: that everyone is subject to the tragedies and pain in a fallen world, that we don't always know what God is doing, that God is seeking to draw us to Himself and strengthen our faith, and that ultimately everything is meaningful and is used by God for the greater good, though it may be impossible for us to perceive and comprehend this in our lifetime. Overall this was an incredibly encouraging book for me personally, and I highly recommend anyone who has interest to read it for some clear answers that are powerfully uplifting and encouraging.

Everyone should read this book and watch Andy Stanley's 3 part series "When God?" It's time God's people understand the tough realities of faith and hardship.
