

The Reys were born in Hamburg, Germany. Hans Augusto Rey (1898-1977) met his wife-to-be, Margret (1906-1996), at a party in her father \tilde{A} ¢ $\hat{a} \neg \hat{a}_{,,,}$ ¢s home in Germany; when he first caught a glimpse of her, she was sliding down the banister. In their twenties and thirties they lived in Paris and in Rio de Janeiro, where Hans sold bathtubs in villages along the River. Eventually Cambridge, Massachusetts, became the Reys \tilde{A} ¢ $\hat{a} \neg \hat{a}_{,,,}$ ¢ home and community. Throughout their lives the Reys created many lively books together, including SPOTTY, PRETZEL, and lift-the-flap books such as HOW DO YOU GET THERE? The manuscript of the first Curious George books was one of the few items the Reys carried with them on their bicycles when they escaped from Paris in 1940. Eventually, they made their way to the United States, and CURIOUS GEORGE was published in 1941. Their incorrigible little monkey has become an American icon, selling millions of books and capturing the hearts of readers everywhere. CURIOUS GEORGE has been published in many languages, including French, German, Japanese, Afrikaans, and Norwegian. I use this with speech therapy for toddlers. All the kids who like George like it somewhat. It's very simple and short so there aren't as many words to focus on as there are in some other books, but for the kids who really love George it does get their attention. The vocabulary that is targeted in this book (penguin, giraffe, panda bear, etc) is a little advanced for the kids I work with who are still young enough to like the short textured books.For my use, I get more mileage out of the textured books that are very simple in content such as the DK publishing "Kitten" or "Puppy" books.

I purchased this for a book exchange for my 1 yr old daughter's preschool class. I let her look at it before I wrapped it, and she loved it. I ended up ordering a second copy for her for Christmas, and she still loves it. There is an opening on the front cover, so that you can "feel" the panda. That same soft texture is also the texture for the first page of the book. There is another similar soft texture for a giraffe later in the book with giraffe print. There is a smooth shiny texture for water, a woven texture for a basket, and a rough, leathery texture for another animal.

If your child is a Curious George fan, this is a great book. It features the new animation of Curious George that has been the style of the cartoon since the movie came out. Some of the books on here for Curious George still feature the old style. In this book, George goes to the zoo. Each page features something for the child to touch. The words are simple, but it is easy to supplement the reading by asking your child how the touchable objects in the book feel, and trying to see if he can describe them to you. George is also playing hide and seek in this book and the reader is asked to find George. There's no challenge in this, even for a 2 year old. Also why would anyone want to hide at the zoo? But there's that element as well.

My son loves Curious George. He has a Curious George stuffed animal and loves to watch the TV show. He also loves reading books before bed and he's 14 months old, so he's mostly entertained by the touch & feel books. This one looked like a great price so I ordered it.I am very satisfied with this book. Each of the pages has a unique thing to touch: a penguin, smooth "water", a rhino's skin, a rough basket. Also on each page, you have to find where George is hiding! (It's not a flap book but George has his head poking out from behind a tree, rock, etc.) Very cute ideas and well executed in

this book. It's also a good size and again, I love the price. I'll have to buy more Curious Geroge books for my son around Christmas time!

This book has something to touch and feel on every page, and my son loves it. It is short and sweet, so I don't feel annoyed reading it 12 times. It is long enough though that its not just open and close. Curious George is cute, and the illustrations are colorful and updated. Well worth my money.

I bought this book to prepare my daughter for our trip to the zoo...My three-year-old LOVES this book, I read it daily to her and it holds her attention. She touches and tells me how the objects feel. She grabs her Curious George and reads the book to him. It is a good interactive book.

My 12mo daughter loves this book. We read it almost every night before bedtime. Her favorite page is the 'bumpy basket' at the end. She even knows how to point out George in all of the pictures where he's "hiding". Going to check out the other Touch and Feel Curious George books too.

Cute but too short, you want more animals to experience; but my grandson loves it. Easy for a toddler to carry around, well made board book. Wipes clean from car snacks to high chair busy baby time.
