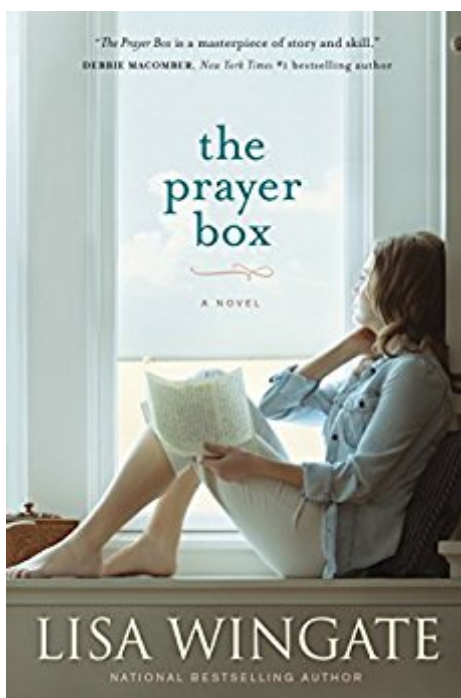

"The Prayer Box" deserves every accolade heaped upon this amazingly well written book. As the reader follows the life of an escapee from an abusive marriage, through her discovery of she truly is, all while uncovering the life of a woman whose quiet philanthropy benefited everyone around her, Lisa Wingate's story sparkles like bits of seaglass dangling in a suncatcher. The reader becomes immersed in the daily struggles of Tandy Jo, her son, J. T., and daughter, Zoey to the point of forgetting this is a novel and not real life. This story moves into the reader's imagination taking up residence as it stirs memories long since forgotten. "The Prayer Box" by Lisa Wingate should be savored like haute cuisine, cherished like a dear friend, and returned to like coming home. This book is a keeper.

Because, as with all good books becoming like friends, it is sad to close the back cover to begin another search for the next great read.

WARNING--This might have a tad of spoiler in the first paragraph, but I hope not. A feel-good story, eventually. Tandi is a serial victim, a product of an extremely dysfunctional family. She believes herself to be unworthy of anything good, and is constantly putting herself in abusive relationships. She discovers prayers written as letters to God, written by an elderly woman, recently deceased. Through reading these prayers, and from the newly-forged friendship of neighbors, she transforms into a woman of strength. I seldom read novels of this genre, but I found myself emotionally invested in her well-being. (Of course I wanted to smack her a few times in the beginning when she was being so irritatingly needy.) There's a surprise at the end of the story that I didn't see coming. I do recommend this book.

I found this ebook on for free after a friend's heads-up and had heard Lisa Wingate's name before but had never read her books. But boy was I glad I did. The Prayer Box was an enjoyable, truth-inspiring read. Each chapter left you turning the pages--not out of dread, but out of concern.

The heroine struggled with real issues and overcame thanks to a town outcast. No spoilers here, but the twist at the end brought tears to my eyes. Lisa's writing is descriptive and well-crafted and the letters from Lola contained some jaw-dropping prose--absolutely amazing imagery combined with poignant truth. I recommend this book for the reader who is looking for great writing and a heart-warming story to enjoy. There are elements of faith in it, but very tastefully handled so as not to preach at the reader. Lisa--great job!! On the same day, I also downloaded *Tidewater Sisters* which is an accompanying novella. I'm looking forward to continuing to follow along with these characters I've come to care for.

Tandi Reese needs a hiding place, but she never expected it to come in the form of Lola Anne Poole's rambling mansion on the Outer Banks. Yet when tasked with cleaning out Lola's house after the older woman dies, Tandis discovers a story that will lead her to stability, faith, and new hope. Tandis is a complex and engaging protagonist and narrator. Much like a real person, there are things to like about her, such as her intelligence and resilience, and things you hope will change, such as her hands-off parenting and tendency to glom onto men who do anything but appreciate and love her. Perhaps that's why it's so gratifying to see her form a sisterhood with the Seashell Shop women, get to know Paul Chastain, and build a life on Hatteras after the definition of a troubled life. Lola, for her part, is a compelling deuterotagonist. In fact, she made me wish Lisa Wingate wrote historical fiction, because her story is just as interesting as Tandis's. Her prayer box letters are touching and filled with deep faith, despite her own travails, such as being banished to a convent school for her mixed-race heritage. Because Lola's part of the novel is epistolary and not as consistent as Tandis's, I felt like I missed out on getting to know this character, but it wasn't a turn-off because the historical and contemporary stories mesh together well. Lisa rounds out her story with other well-drawn characters such as Paul, a man who doesn't fit the stereotype of a romantic hero but is the kind of guy Tandis needs, and Zoey, a daughter who is deciding whether to follow her mom's path or believe she can be and do better. Finally, I like that the Christian element of *The Prayer Box*, while present, is not overpowering. You can safely presume Tandis will find faith, but her journey feels authentic, not clichéd. Saying the Sinner's Prayer and going to church, Lisa hints, won't fix everything for Tandis. What will, is finding God--and Christ in Him--and believing who He says she is and always was. I love how Lola, through her prayer box, had an opportunity to teach Tandis this.

I know Lisa from Facebook, and her Huckleberry Reports brighten my days. But, Oh My Goodness.

What a wonderful book. A woman discovering herself, struggling to raise her children in a safer and happier way than she herself came up. A beautiful old house with secrets. A community of loving and caring people. So comforting, so encouraging, so invigorating! You will love this book, I know. I can't wait to find more of Lisa's work. What a blessing.
