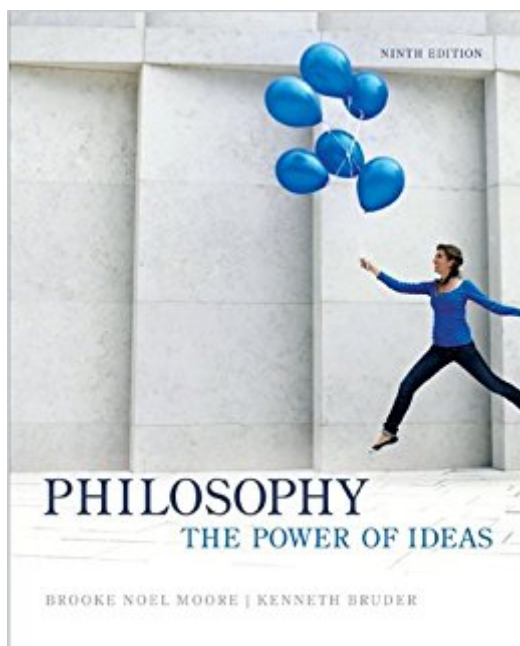


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Philosophy: The Power Of Ideas

The newer edition sells for more than \$160. so I think I got a very good deal here at .The material is well organized and it's very easy to read and understand. The ideas are very well expressed and there are thumb nail sketches of the major contributors in philosophy, thereby making their thoughts and philosophies easy to grasp. One of the nice things in this book is a time line chart for the world's philosophers on the front and rear inside covers, allowing the reader to see at a glance the time period each of them lived and from where they came. There are pronouncing guides for some of the more difficult philosopher's names. There is an index-glossary at the end of the book. Not only are the great Western philosophers discussed but also the Eastern ones from the orient like Confucius and Zen Buddhism. Some of the works by feminists and female philosophers as well as Black writers like Martin Luther King are discussed. Additionally, there are many readings in this book. While I have read this book for my own personal pleasure, if I was actually taking an accredited class at university, this is the book I would prefer to study.
