


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# Gardner's Art Through The Ages: Backpack Edition, Book A: Antiquity

Long acclaimed for his inspiring lectures and dedication to students, Professor Kleiner won Boston University's Metcalf Award for Excellence in Teaching, as well as the College Prize for Undergraduate Advising in the Humanities in 2002, and he is a two-time winner of the Distinguished Teaching Prize in the College of Arts and Sciences Honors Program. In 2007, he was elected fellow of the Society of Antiquaries of London, and, in 2009, in recognition of lifetime achievement in publication and teaching, fellow of the Text and Academic Authors Association.

This book and the rest of the Gardner's Art Through the Ages: Backpack Edition books allow newcomers to art history to gain a basic understanding of the subject. It introduces basic art movements, periods, and styles and presents numerous examples. The books are rich in color and present the basic information about art pieces. That being said, the books often focus on art styles and periods that appeal to the author(s). There is quite a bit of bias within the descriptions of the pieces and styles; the writers often declare certain pieces the "best" of their era without explaining why art historians appreciate the pieces so much. There is also a large emphasis placed on Christian art. While this is acceptable in the eras that focus on Christianity, the books often compare the art of the non-Christian cultures, like the Ancient Egyptians and the Greeks, to the art of the Middle Ages and Renaissance. While it did point out the origin of some of the art traditions and practices that would become popular with Christian art, I am not sure it is appropriate to constantly praise the Christian art and ignore the achievements of non-Christian cultures. Overall, a good introduction to art history. However, it falls short.

This is the first book (Book A) in a four part series. It is complete with excellent textual information and vibrant color pictures. I needed it for school, and it was far cheaper on compared to my school's bookstore. It shipped quickly, which was great since, again, I needed it for school. I love the fact that it was a backpack edition, since the full book is about 800 pages. This one was only around 200, so it was very easy to carry around school. If you need the full set, go with the Backpack

editions.
