

The stated "numerous full-color reproductions" is inaccurate. Nineteen images are squeezed inside the back cover. The images inside the book are invented to complement the fictionalized words of Gauguin's daughter and also wood-cut style portions of Gauguin's work. Many of them are nudes. As an art teacher who chops books apart to use for bulletin boards, this book was a disappointment.

After reading W. Sumerset Maugham's `The Moon and Sixpence' said to have been based on the life of Paul Gauguin, (can someone tell me why that title?), I decided to read a Gauguin's biography just to see exactly what is meant by "Based on the life of..." means.
