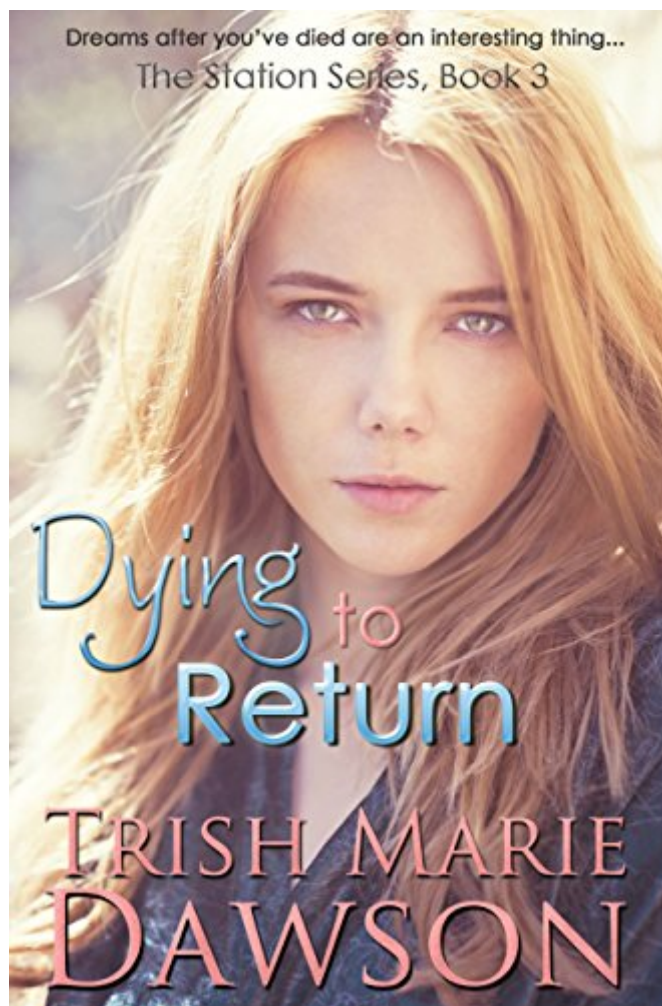

An amazing story, as deeply emotional as the first two books in The Station series. There are moments that become just as deeply personal for the reader as they are for the characters in the book. This is a series that is, in a single word, exceptional. There is such love in the book... love between friends, romantic love, and love that falls somewhere in between. It provides a completely

new perspective on life, the afterlife, and just what is out there. There is a lot of imagination and creativity in this story and opens the reader to possibilities that might never have occurred to them. There is an undeniable thread of hope through even the darkest of times which is a comforting thought. On a personal note, I read these books during a pretty dark time of my own, and there were times that I questioned whether or not it was the right time to read them. There were times when I thought my heart was breaking, sobbing as I read on. But they gave me hope for my own dark time and that is a beautiful thing. Like the last book, there were surprises, too. There were times when I wondered just how I felt about those surprises and that kept me turning the pages. Things to love about Dying to Return... --The emotions. Sad, happy, loving, uncertainty. They were all there and they all affect you as a reader. --The beauty. There is such poignancy in this series and it shines through at unexpected times. --The surprises. Oh, and there were some. Some good, some bad, some that made you angry, some that were bittersweet. But all were engaging. My recommendation: I was sad to finish this book, thinking it was the end of a series that I am not ready to let go. But I talked to the author and it is NOT the end. It is, however, the end of Piper's story, but there will be more from The Station! This is a series that truly affected me, changed my life a bit, and I HIGHLY recommend it!

I have really enjoyed reading this series and am happy to recommend it to anyone. It is an interesting and unusual take on the after-life, filled with engaging and complex characters that are relatable and that also change and grow through the series. I definitely suggest reading through the first two books before getting to this one as the story grows with the main character. Compared to the other two I did not find this story quite as engaging, however I still really enjoyed it, I wish I could give half stars because I feel like 4-I like it doesn't quite cover it, yet 5-I love it is too strong for me to agree with on this one

I just kind of "happened" across this series. I can't really explain why I decided to read it but, once I did, I was instantly caught up in it. It is geared toward a younger crowd, but the story line is different, and new. It definitely has a lesson involved, although, it's almost mandatory that all three books are read before coming to that lesson. That won't be too difficult though, since the books are short and the story flows easily and quickly. I'd recommend it.

So much to say about this third book in the series, but can't spoil it!! It was wonderful. The ride takes you along as Piper has grown up in the books, and now she becomes an adult, still in a teenage

body. There is confusing young love, heartache, bewilderment, acceptance, forgiveness, redemption, and finally finding oneself. Simply a fulfilling read.

I have to admit that the extraterrestrial si-fi stuff was a bit much for me when the story took that turn but the author did a great job of bringing it all back around to something that was believable. I felt there could have been a little more development of the time spent in the other realm and of Piper's training and that may have helped to support/build the relationship the author was creating between Piper & Rush and Piper & Della. This third book ends well. There is closure should this be the end of the story as well as enough threads that a 4th book could be added to the series and readers would feel as if they were picking up right where they left off.

this is not the kind of book that i normally read. i don't even remember what made me purchase the first one in the series. of course once i purchased the first one in the series i had to go ahead and follow through to the end. i will not say this is a book that i couldn't put down, because half way through it, a book that i had preordered came through so i stopped reading dying to return and read the new book i had been waiting for. however, after reading the new book, (unwelcome child, by v.c. andrews) i continued reading dying to return. it was a nice read, and i did enjoy it. it certainly gave me some "food for thought"

This is the third of a story about a girl named Piper who has committed suicide. She works in the Station as a volunteer who prevents others to commit suicide, as a voice in the subconscious. Piper has evolved from a frightened girl(spirit?) in the 1st book, to a brilliant volunteer in the 2nd, and to a unique, more powerful entity in this 3rd book. The stories have evolved along with her status. Romantic feeling develops with the creator of the Station who is a prince from another planet, and with a volunteer whom she tried to save. The episode with the frightened little girl was so touching. I just had to read all the books, and still wishing for more.

While I enjoyed this whole series, this was my least favorite of the three books. Even though it's sort of an unbelievable premise, the first two books sort of suck you in and have you believing it. This third one just lost me and was more sci fi than anything.
