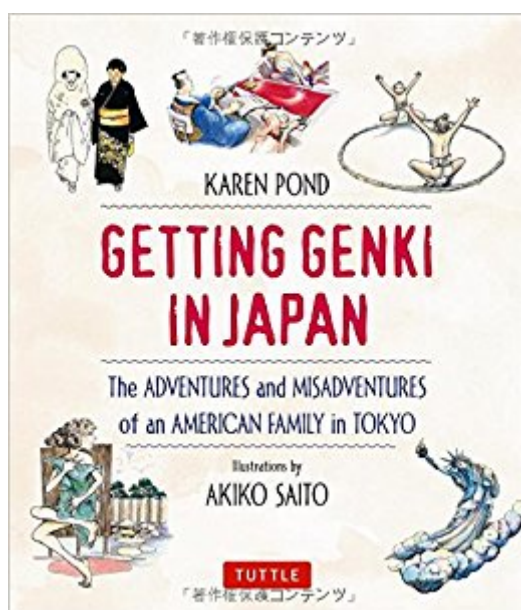

Karen Pond worked as a catalog copywriter for LL Bean before moving to Tokyo with her family, where she chronicled her culture shock with essays that appeared in *INTOUCH Magazine*, *Tokyo Families Magazine*, and *Being A Broad Magazine*. Karen still lives in Tokyo, Japan, with her husband, three sons, and their border collie Fergus.

A lot of funny stuff in this book that I'd recommend that folks feeling out of place in Japan read to help them see the humorous side of things that they may be finding frustrating while living in Japan. Japan's a wonderful place to live if you just take the time to immerse yourself in the culture and venture outside your comfort zone. We loved our times in Japan (2 assignments at Yokota Air Base, Japan)!

Pond takes a lighthearted look at her own faux pas and the struggle between her Maine sensibility and the sometimes inexplicable and complicated Japanese culture. Pond takes us grocery shopping, to her language lessons, and on the subways of Tokyo, always managing to find the humor as she fumbles words and customs. Many of these essays are magazine pieces, previously published in Japan. Standout essays for me include Pond's initial attempt at eating edamame, and the chewing chewing chewing of the outside pod. I also enjoyed her adventures at the police station, trying to report a lost wallet, and the always entertaining grocery store adventures. Pond has a rare gift of being able to laugh at herself. Her family good naturedly help her out in her adventures. Readers with overseas experiences - especially in Asia or Japan - will enjoy this very funny collection.

Having known the author for three years in Tokyo and hearing some of her `tales' firsthand it was wonderful to relive the hilarious moments of a `newbie' to Japan trying to navigate life in a foreign place. From being mistaken for an exotic dancer to coming home with a pregnancy test for her husband instead of antacid, her pantomiming skills and language `faux pas' fuel the hilarity of her daily mis-adventures. She truly has a gift of finding the humour in the sometimes not so funny moments of life abroad. I couldn't put her book down and can't wait for the second edition! Keep the stories coming `tiger'!
