The book was helpful, although some of the prices listed were were a little inaccurate. While it would increase the book's price, a few colored pictures and/or maps would be helpful. Detailed maps of downtown London would be more helpful.We have purchased other Rick Steves guide books and have generally pleased with all of them including England.

We've enjoyed Rick Steves' shows on PBS for a long time and now that we are planning a trip to the U.K., we decided we needed his book. I think his travel tips are spot on, and I appreciate the fact that he readily voices negative opinions as well as positive. One caveat, this book does not include every place you might like to stay. For example, both Truro and Exeter are not in the book.

Rick Steves' guidebooks never fail to deliver. We are in York, England right now and have found his information invaluable. His maps are helpful, and we have especially liked his recommended walks. We have used his guides in the past (Germany, Austria, the Netherlands, France). The places he has recommended for eating and sleeping have always been great!

In the 1970s I travelled around Europe on Arthur Frommer's "10 A Day in Europe." Rick Steves book is even better with more tips to save money and helpful hints on how not to look like a rookie in England. I took a Rick Steves trip to Norway several years ago and was enormously pleased that I saw as much as I did for what seemed the perfect trip. Since then, I have watched his films on National Public Television and now believe he is the top travel guide in the business. My recommendation for anyone traveling to Europe is they should not even start planning until first having procured a copy of the essential Rick Steve travel guide. Dennis L. Cripps Rick Steves' guide was SO useful on our recent trip to England. We rented a car and from Yorkshire drove to the Cotswolds, on to the city of Bath and then into Cornwall. We used his guide for overnight accommodations, eateries, and interesting sites. We had no problems finding B&Bs or guesthouses with openings. If not for Rick, we would not have found our last guesthouse - a lovely place in St. Ives overlooking the sea. Great resource. Rick is thorough and down-to-earth.

On my way home I threw out the book to cut down on weight in my luggage. He publishes updates so often there is not much need to keep the old ones.
