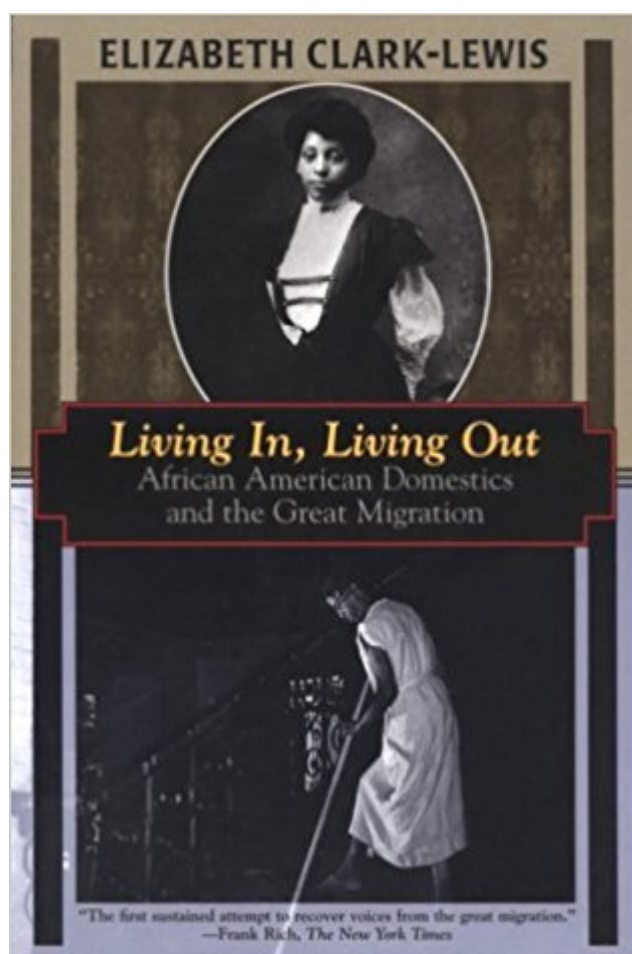

This was an excellent book with pictures and first-hand accounts of what it meant to be a domestic worker for African American women in post-Civil War and early twentieth century life in Washington, D.C. As an African American woman and native Washingtonian, it was particularly difficult reading these stories. However, despite the hardships and unnecessary treatment, many of these women went on to create strong and enduring legacies of hard work and thrift for their families and grandchildren. My only comment would have been the desire to hear from the white women who had employed these women -- to see from their perspectives how they regarded that relationship. I recommend this book to women (and men) of all races who care deeply about equality, equity, and social justice.
