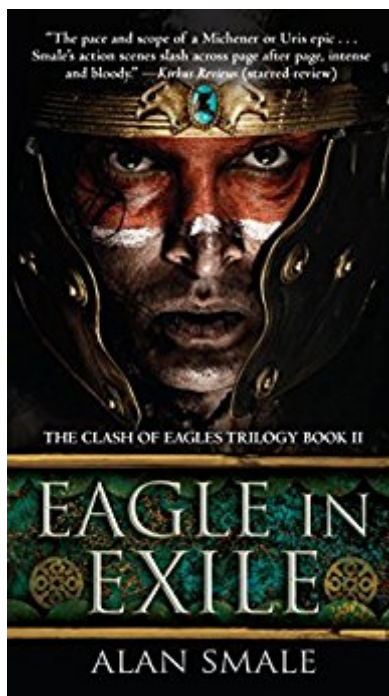

I loved the first entry in the trilogy, but I'm a huge Roman history buff so I'm pretty bias. Like some others have said this one starts a little slow, in fact I remember thinking maybe I wouldn't be able to get into it and was a little disappointed. However after the first few chapters it drew me in and I couldn't put it down, there are some nice twists here and there and this book sets up the third one nicely. Really looking forward to that one! It will be off the wall.

This is one of my favorite alternate history story. Once you accept flying Indians everything else is plausible. Even the flying Indians isn't to far fetched. The idea of the Roman empire still in existence and affecting North America is a unique story.

This is the second book in the series: it tells a little more about the "Hesperians," the name the Romans give the Native Americans. It's not quite as interesting, action-wise, as the first book, but it's very interesting in its way. I really liked it, and am looking forward to book three!

I like alternate history and this series is a bit innovative as it focuses on the middle American First Nations as protagonists. I'd say this like Turtledove and Card collaborated.

It started slightly slow for the first 20 or 30 pages, but was very needed to set the tone for the rest of the book as it is a continuation from the first book, but what a huge unexpected surprise soon as I got past that and it is a page turner onward. Not disappointed and cannot wait for the third book coming out May 2017.

Really different but interesting and exciting alternate history-type book and series. I really loved the whole concept and all the books. I hope there are more to come!
