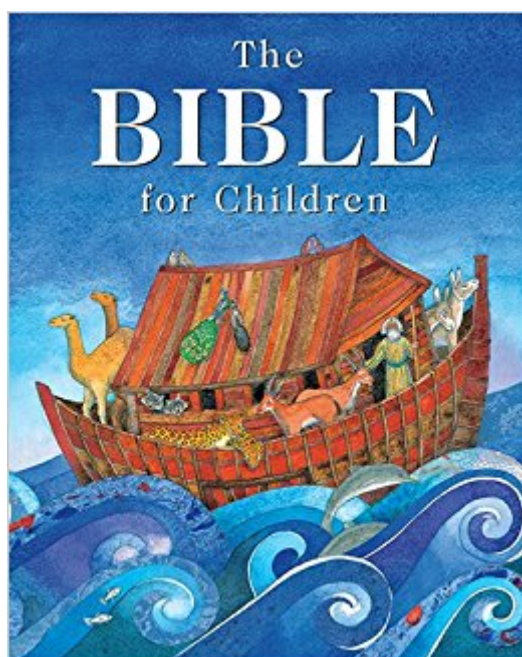

I teach religion at an Episcopal School and this is the children's Bible I choose for most of my classes up to third grade, as well as for Sunday School. I like the exciting yet faithful narration of the stories, with a few added details to help children imagine what these places might have looked like and to get them wondering how the people in the stories might have been feeling. I LOVE that these illustrations don't suffer from the "white Jesus" problem that most do. The pictures are beautiful and vibrant, and the children in my classes always want me to bring the book around so each can get a closer look. This is always the first children's Bible I recommend when families ask about a Bible to have for their kids to read at home.

I would almost give this book 5 stars. I love the range of stories in the book. I love, love, LOVE the artwork. The only thing that is difficult about this book is that the reading level is fairly high. I use this book in my church for kids from 3 years-5th grade. Some of the vocabulary needs to be explained even to the 5th graders. I don't mind this too much because it brings chances for vocabulary discussion but I definitely think there is a lot that needs explaining for the child.

This book is beautifully illustrated and the Biblical characters are not painted as blonde Anglo-Saxons, which my whole family appreciates. The text makes Bible stories easier to

understand for young minds, without being too saccharine for the adult who's reading aloud, which I appreciate. But if you want an exact copy of the King James text, just with pictures added for kids, another book is probably better.

I appreciated the clear and appealing writing style as well as the attractive illustrations in this book of Bible stories for children. However, it is not free from additions and interpretations as some reviewers have written. The author adds non-biblical details in order to make the stories more interesting and these details affect the reader's interpretation of the stories. This may be disappointing for buyers looking for unbiased retellings of the stories.

Our 6 and 4 year old children enjoy the stories and illustrations while I'm reading to them. They are always excited to each pick a story to be read to them. The stories are told in an easily understandable language for children from about 6 years old. Written in Chapters with Bible reference under the title of each chapter heading. The chapters are a good length for our 6 year old daughter who do not lose interest. My 4 year old son may start to lose interest closer to the end though. We have other children's bibles and the kids like to include this one with the other when they pick stories to be read to them. We are happy with this purchase.

We love The Bible For Children! The illustrations are beautifully done and the Bible stories are accurate and easy to understand. We have three small children (4.5, 3, 1.5 yrs) who cherish our time reading through this rendition of the Bible! The stories include some words that need to be explained but I don't count that as a negative quality. I feel as though the choice of wording serves to expand my children's growing vocabulary as well as set this book aside from others which tend to be less detailed and more childish in their presentation. We would recommend this book to anyone!
