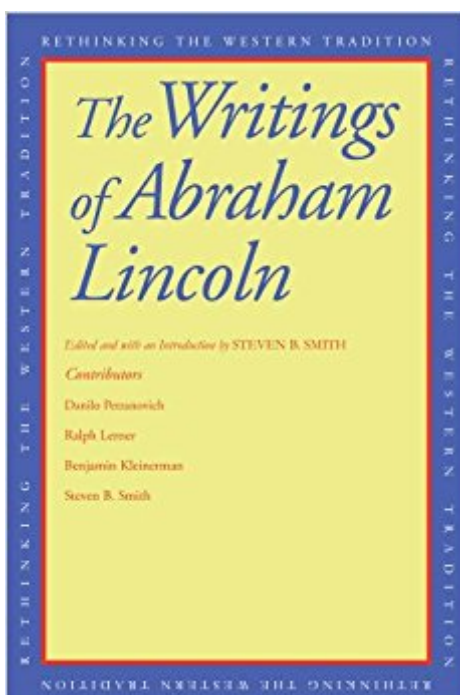

Synopsis

Abraham Lincoln never wrote a book: his ideas are contained in speeches, letters, and various occasional writings. By bringing these works together into a single anthology, this book shows that Lincoln deserves to be counted among the great political philosophers. In addition to many examples of Lincoln's writings, this volume includes four interpretive essays that will provide an intellectual feast for any reader exploring his complex legacy. Danilo Petranovich looks at Lincoln's conception of the Union and its radically new focus on purging the nation of the problem of slavery. Ralph Lerner reconsiders Lincoln's relation to the American framers and in particular his effort to put the Declaration of Independence on a new foundation. Benjamin Kleinerman examines Lincoln's always controversial views on the scope of executive power during war. And Steven Smith considers the place of religion in Lincoln's political thought through a close reading of his Second Inaugural Address.

This is an incredible source. It shows Lincoln's progression from his humble political beginnings in 1836 to reelected President of the United States in 1865. The reader can really get a sense of

Lincoln's political brilliance during the Lincoln/Douglas debates and in the early part of his Administration and his battle of wits and will with Seward. The table of contents makes it easier to find speeches during a specific part of Lincoln's career allowing for easy citing for papers or readings in the classroom.

Being from the great state of Illinois I've always admired and read with delight anything on "Abe." While we don't normally think micro managing is the best leadership style, I believe that this time in our history a micromanager was required and he was an expert at it! He understood the importance of communication and used the telegraph to pull it off.

If you like reading about Lincoln this may be your read. Be warned, much of what is here is political dissertation of the time and as such is very dry. On the other hand his wartime telegrams give insight into a man who wanted to be very much involved in the actions of his troops. I especially enjoyed his dispatchs to General McClellan. His letters and spechs make clear his real feeling on blacks, slavery and the Emancipation Proclamation. All evidence of the real Lincoln.

For 99 cents I have purchased the complete writings of Lincoln, and the copy is mistake free after a few hours of reading. The table of contents is fully interactive and simple to use. It's noteworthy in this age of dodging profit seekers in all and any guises that this type of transaction can still be made. It's great!
